New tuition benefit headed our way



From Capitol Hill—If your last duty station wasn't in Connecticut, you might have been faced with the additional burden of paying out -of-state tuition rates when you started at UConn. Thousands of vets across the country have faced the same issue, but that's about to change. As part of the 2014 Veterans Access to Care legislation passed this summer, any veteran or dependent who uses Chapter 33 Post -9/11 GI Bill or Chapter 30 Montgomery GI Bill benefits within three years of their discharge will be given in-state tuition rates at the University of Connecticut. PLEASE NOTE, this portion of the law will take effect July 1, 2015, and will be applied for the Fall 2015 term. Have questions? Give us a call or stop by to see us in Arjona.
