Veteran of the Month: Anna-Kay Paul

The Office of Veterans Affairs & Military Programs (VAMP) at UConn is pleased to honor Anna-Kay Paul as our Veteran of the Month for September 2019. Anna-Kay is from the beautiful island of Jamaica and migrated to America at the age of 13 where she lived in the Bronx, New York. Anna-Kay attended the Frederick Douglass Academy located in Manhattan, New York. Unlike many of her friends in high school who went straight to college after graduation, Anna-Kay went straight into the Military (Army).

She joined the Army as a 12B-Combat Engineer where she was assigned to Headquarters Company. She was the first female Combat engineer for her Battalion. In February of 2017, Anna-Kay deployed to Kuwait and Afghanistan where she learned company operations and the local culture of the countries. In February of last year Anna-Kay returned home and she spent time transitioning back to her "American life." During this process, she decided to continue her education and

Enrolled in classes at Goodwin College starting in the summer of last year. While attending Goodwin, she took on a full time position as a security officer at Travelers last Fall. Her job quickly came into conflict with her classes and of course, Anna-Kay chose to work because she had to "get that bag," or so she thought. That's when Anna-Kay started to reflect on her life and dug deep within herself, reminding herself that she wanted to be a nurse not a security guard.

Her goal is to pursue a degree in Business Finance and then move onto the eleven month nursing program.
