Ryan Bangham

is the Director of Absence



Management at UConn in addition to being a Navy Veteran, who continues to serve in the Navy Reserves, currently as the Commanding Officer of the Expeditionary Combat Readiness Center in Gulfport, MS. He is currently a member on UConn's Veterans Advisory Council and he was the keynote speaker at UConn's Veterans Day Ceremony this year.

Commander Ryan T. Bangham is a native of Farmington, CT. His educational background includes a Master of Business Administration from UConn in addition to coursework and seminars completed at the Naval War College, University of Hartford, and the Naval Science Institute. He was commissioned via the Enlisted Commissioning program in 2002.

Bangham has served as the Assistant Training Officer onboard USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN-71), Communications Systems Director with Joint Task Force 700 (Horn of Africa), Operations Officer at Naval Recruiting District New England, Officer in Charge of Operational Support Unit at Navy Operational Support Center Newport, Casualty Assistance Officer with the POW/MIA division of the Navy Casualty Office, instructor at the Direct Commission Officer School (DCO) at Officer Training Command in Newport, Rhode Island, J1 Deputy Director at Joint Task Force Guantanamo Bay, and the Executive Officer of United States Fleet Forces (USFF) N1 unit. He was enlisted from 1994-2002 serving aboard USS Boxer (LHD-4) and Naval Station Rota Spain.

Bangham has executed afloat operational deployments including both a Mediterranean cruise and two western pacific deploymnets. He has completed two deployments in support of Operation Desert Fox with the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) and executed support missions in support of operations in Kosovo.
