Veteran of the Month

Dr. Carlita Cotton

The Office of Veterans Affairs & Military Programs (VAMP) at UConn is pleased to recognize Dr. Carlita Cotton as UConn's Veteran of the Month. Dr. Cotton is a UConn Alum and will be the keynote speaker for the Veterans



Day Ceremony at UConn this month. Dr. Carlita Cotton is a native of Birminham, Alabama. She holds a B.A. in Russian Language & Literature from the State University of New York at Albany, Master of Divinity in Pastoral Counseling & Theological Education from Howard University, and a PhD in Educational Psychology from the University of Connecticut.

Dr. Cotton served in the United States Air Force for 10 years, 16 days, and 8 hours. She enlisted in the Air Force on November 16, 1980, and honorably retired as a Technical Sergeant on November 30, 2000. During this time, she served in multiple locations, including overseas in the Persian Gulf and Cold War.

When it was time for career selections, Dr. Cotton was chosent to be a translator. A colleague told her that black people don't have the aptitude to learn Russian; she became a Russian translator.In addition to being a Linguist, Dr. Cotton has experience working as a Language Analyst and Supervisor, Joint Military Awards Director, Human Resources Intelligence Strategic Debriefer, and an Interrogator.

Her personal awards include the Air Force Achievement Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal (2), Air Force Longevity Award (4), Air Force Training Award, Army Occupation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, CT Wartime Service Medal, and she is a class of 2021 CT Veterans Hall of Fame inductee.

In her civilian career, Dr. Cotton continues to educate and lead others as she did in the Air Force. She teaches Psychology as an Online Associate Professor at Post University, is a Lead Professor and Board of Trustee Member at Charter Oak State College, and as Clergy and Pastoral Couselor at New Roots AME & Stanley Chapel AME Zion churches. She also currently serves as a Town Coucilor for Mansfield, CT.
