The Office of Veterans and Military Programs provides a supportive environment for all veterans, members of the military, and dependents who attend UConn. You can find us in Hawley Armory, where you can get assistance with benefits and resources.

The Veteran Community encompasses nearly 1,500 students, staff and faculty who are:

- Current Active Duty military and members of any of the uniformed services
- Current members of the Air or Army National Guard
- Current active or inactive Reservists of any of the armed services
- Those who have previously served in any capacity in the uniformed services
- Spouses, children, and any other dependents of any current or prior member of the uniformed services

Applying For Benefits

Connecticut State Tuition Waivers

The law requires state colleges to waive tuition fees for wartime veterans (1) honorably discharged from active service, (2) accepted for admission to the institutions, and (2) residing in Connecticut at the time of acceptance.

It applies to the University of Connecticut, Connecticut State University (CSU), and Community-Technical College System.

The law defines “tuition” as a “direct charge for institutional programs, which is clearly delineated from any other fees.

You can get credit for Basic Training and/or additional years of active duty. Please scan a copy of your DD-214 Member 4 copy to Alyssa Kelleher at alyssa.kelleher@uconn.edu. (Note: If you are an ROTC cadet, the credit is contingent upon the written approval of the appropriate Department Head.) Courses will appear on UConn transcript and be assigned a grade of "T" and will be considered unassigned electives.

You may also be able to get college credit for being stationed in, or for deployments to, foreign countries. This credit will be issued as a three-credit course, MISI 92001 Foreign Study in Military Science, with the following requirements:

- Honorable service
- Proof of being stationed/deployed to a foreign country for 90 days or more
- Completion of a written assignment
- Interview with the VAMP (Veterans & Military Programs) Director

Please contact Alyssa Kelleher for more details about the requirements for the written assignment and to request a meeting once the written assignment is complete. Currently, this course will be creditable as an unassigned elective, and will be assigned a grade of "T" on the UConn transcript.
