

## **Veteran of the Month**

**Marcos Rico** 

The Office of Veterans & Military Programs (VAMP) at UConn is pleased to recognize Marcos Rico as UConn's Veteran of the Month. Marcos is a proud undergrad in the Urban Forestry and Arboriculture degree program, born in Bolivia, he immigrated and grew up in Rhode Island.

Marcos enlisted in the Army Reserves as a Private in 1985 and rose to the rank of Staff Sergent (E-6). In 1995, Marcos transitioned to active duty, serving as an enlisted soldier where he



made it to the rank of Sergent First Class (E-7) until 2008 where he crossed over to become a Warrant Officer and he retired in 2016 as a Warrant Officer 2 (CW2). Marcos was deployed on three separate occasions to Iraq in 2003, 2005 and 2006 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. During Reconstruction in Iraq, he mentored and taught military intelligence to his Iraqi counterparts. He also deployed to Afghanistan in 2011 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Marcos served alongside his brother who also served the Army and Army Reserves. Before he retired he was an instructor at Fort Huachuca and years later, from time to time he would run into some of the personnel he taught there and they would come up to him thanking him because what Marcos taught them in that course "kept me alive."

Marcos resides in Wethersfield and is currently a member of Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, a national organization he volunteers with other Combat Disabled Veterans in teaching fly tying, fly casting, and rod building. He shares that Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, "turned my life around from contemplating suicide to where I am now at UConn." Marcos shares that he is always surprised at the number of Veterans who don't use their benefits. His one piece of advice to his fellow Veterans is to be sure to get connected with the VA for benefits, including for medical, disability, etc. since these are benefits that were earned and exist to help Veterans in their day to day lives.
